We could not be prouder to share that 14 out of our 18 Infinite Family Net Buddies earned a Bachelor's Degree pass with a combined 23 distinctions.

Infinite Family mentored matric students exceeded the national Bachelor's average by 38%! Two of our students earned a Diploma pass and two will be taking a couple of subjects again in June. This is an outstanding achievement for teens in Alexandra, Khayelitsha, and Soweto, whose young lives and education have been so badly compromised — by their apartheid roots, their economic circumstances, the toxic stress they experience daily and, during their most crucial academic years, by Covid.

Credit for their discipline, focus and resilience goes entirely to our Net Buddies and Infinite Family is gratified to have played a role in helping them build the skills, and make the future-forward decisions that Happy mentions on the previous page. We are also deeply grateful to the parents and guardians who are behind them. This has not always been the case.

It has taken Infinite Family 15 years to persuade the communities we work with of the value of keeping their teens in school, rather than encouraging them to drop out and seek work. Now, for the first time, we're engaging with them via WhatsApp groups and regular meetings. While this may be regular among parents of teens who live in wealthier communities, we appreciate the extra effort these parents must make to be involved. As a result, our Matric graduation celebrations in December were especially joyful!

We're off to an equally positive start in 2024.

For the first time, we have registered our Net Buddies using our online resources after hours and on personal/shared devices from URLs in their community. This may not seem significant to our stakeholders who are accustomed to readily available connectivity, but for Infinite Family, it means that — finally — we will be able to work with teens who do not reside near our LaunchPads. We have waited almost a decade for this signal that it is time to take the next technology leap and build an online platform to serve all of South Africa's teens!

It can't happen soon enough ... but before we can flip the switch, we have to build our local team to manage this growth and expansion. We took our first, exploratory steps in Q3 2023 and will continue as fast as conditions allow.

With the global challenges we're all facing, there will be hurdles — and locally, loadshedding is chief among them — but Infinite Family has much to teach the wider world about innovation in education delivery, and we're looking forward to preparing the next generation for a brighter future.
